BACKGROUND: July 28, 2022, representatives from the Town and Freese and Nichols met with the Corp of Engineers to review the 30% draft plans of Stephens Road and discuss the Environmental Permitting that would or may be required from the Corp. The original Engineering Authorization did not include Environmental Permitting because we weren't sure about the road alignment and potential impact until surveying and a draft plan was developed.

The meeting with the Corp was productive and helped with the alignment to reduce possible impact and permitting requirements. The proposed amendment provides for the Environmental work needed based on our meeting. We are also requesting a \$5,000.00 authorization for contingency if something arises that was not foreseen.

Amendment #1 - Addition of Environmental Permitting and Construction Inspection services

Description of Services:

ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITTING: \$37,000

It is Freese and Nichols, Inc. (FNI) understanding that the Town of Carlton Landing is proposing to extend a section of Stephens Road, located in Pittsburg County, Oklahoma, by approximately 2,800 linear feet (If). The proposed roadway extension is needed to provide public access to recreational facilities located on U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) fee-owned land adjacent to Lake Eufaula. It is FNI's understanding that the Town of Carlton Landing has entered into a lease agreement with the USACE for development of the property for recreational purposes, including the land where the proposed roadway extension would be located. It is also FNI's understanding that the area where the proposed roadway would be located on USACE property was reviewed under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) as part of the USACE's Eufaula Lake Shoreline Management Plan Revision and Master Plan Supplement dated March 2013. Based on feedback from Tulsa District USACE staff during a meeting held on July 28, 2022, the Town of Carlton Landing is not required to obtain an easement from the USACE for construction/extension of Stephens Road across USACE property as a result of the lease agreement between the Town and the USACE. In addition, the roadway extension will not require review under NEPA as a result of the Carlton Landing development being evaluated as part of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) that was prepared for the USACE's Eufaula Lake Shoreline Management Plan Revision and Master Plan Supplement.

Although an easement from the USACE would not be required for the proposed extension of Stephens Road, approval to construct on USACE property would be required. As such, the Town of Carlton Landing will be required to prepare and submit a Construction Request Checklist and Construction Consent Request letter to the USACE Eufaula Lake Office for review and approval prior to construction. In addition, the proposed project would require Section 404 permit authorization from the USACE, as the action would involve the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the U.S. The following scope of services assumes that the proposed project could be designed and constructed to meet the terms and conditions of Nationwide Permit (NWP) 14, Linear Transportation Projects. NWP-14 authorizes activities required for crossings of waters of the United States associated with the construction, expansion, modification, or improvement of linear transportation projects (e.g., roads, highways, railways, trails, driveways, airport runways, and taxiways) in waters of the United States. For linear transportation projects in non-tidal waters, the discharge of dredged or fill material cannot cause the loss of greater than 1/2-acre of waters of the United States. Because the proposed roadway extension would be constructed on USACE property, the Town of Carlton Landing will be required to prepare and submit a Pre-construction Notification (PCN) to the district engineer prior to commencing the activity. Following are the tasks that we propose to assist the Town in obtaining the necessary Consent to Construct on USACE property and Section 404 permit authorization.

Task 1. Compile and Review Existing Information

FNI will compile and review readily available existing information to assist in the preparation of the Construction Consent letter and NWP-14 PCN. The types of information that will be gathered and reviewed will include, but is not limited to, the FEIS for the USACE's Eufaula Lake Shoreline Management Plan Revision and Master Plan Supplement (including the Biological Opinion issued by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)), the revised Shoreline Management Plan and Master Plan, the lease agreement between the USACE and the Town of Carlton Landing, construction drawings for the proposed roadway extension, U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-minute topographic

maps, USFWS National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) maps, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) soils maps, as well as recent and historical aerial photographs of the site.

Task 2. Prepare Preliminary Jurisdictional Determination (PJD) Report

FNI will prepare a PJD report for submittal to the Tulsa District USACE based on the findings of a pedestrian survey that was completed by FNI in March 2022. The report will follow standard PJD report format and will be supported by figures, tables, and photographs. The report will also include discussions of methodologies used, site descriptions, hydrologic characterizations, locations of floodplains, descriptions of upland and wetland vegetation, soil characteristics, and riparian areas. The PJD report will be an attachment to the NWP-14 PCN that will be submitted to the USACE.

Task 3. Prepare Pre-Construction Notification (PCN)

Information gathered and reviewed as part of Task 1 and the pedestrian survey will be used to prepare a draft NWP-14 PCN. The PCN will follow the Nationwide Permit PCN Form ENG 6082 format and will include the PJD report as an attachment.

Task 4. Prepare Construction Consent Letter

FNI will prepare a Construction Consent letter for submittal to the Tulsa District USACE. The letter will contain detailed descriptions of the proposed roadway extension, including its location, construction methods, cut/fill quantities, fills below the 602' elevation (upper guide contour), culvert locations, drainage improvements, construction materials, etc.

Task 5. Complete Construction Request Checklist and Compile Construction Request Package

FNI will complete the Construction Request Checklist. This task will include compiling all necessary data and information into a construction request package for submittal to the USACE Eufaula Lake office. The package will contain the PJD report and NWP-14 PCN, Construction Consent letter, detailed descriptions of the proposed roadway, including survey and design drawings, and other information necessary for the USACE to process the construction request. This package will be submitted to the Town of Carlton Landing for review and comment. Once comments are received, a final construction request package will be prepared and submitted to the USACE for approval.

Task 6. Coordination.

It is anticipated that coordination with project engineers, Town staff, and USACE staff will be necessary to prepare the construction request package. This task includes meetings, conference calls, and other coordination efforts. This task does not include additional site visits or in-person meetings with Town or Tulsa District USACE staff.

CONTIGENCY (by separate authorization): \$5,000

This is a contingency to be used only through authorization from the Town Administrator for additional items that could result from the coordination and permitting process with the USACE.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES (not anticipated):

The following services are beyond the scope of services described in the tasks above, but they can be provided, if deemed necessary, upon written authorization by the Town.

- 1. Preparation of a formal written request for USACE authorization under a letter of permission procedure.
- 2. Preparation of a standard individual Section 404 permit application.
- 3. Preparation of Environmental Information Document, Environmental Assessment, or an Environmental Impact Statement.
- 4. Presence/absence surveys for federally listed threatened/endangered species.
- 5. Preparation of a mitigation plan to compensate for impacts to waters of the U.S., or non-statutory mitigation for impacts to USACE-owned property.
- 6. Preparation of a mitigation plan to offset losses to flood storage capacity.
- 7. Application to ODEQ for individual 401 Water Quality Certification.
- 8. Additional field investigations or analysis required to respond to regulatory agency comments.
- 9. Consultation with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service under Section 7 of the Endangered Species act.

- 10. Cultural resources surveys.
- 11. Expert representation at legal proceedings or at contested hearings.
- 12. Mitigation monitoring if required by permit conditions.
- 13. Monitoring for compliance with permit conditions.

Amended Deliverables: Deliverables will be per the original contract except as modified or noted above.

Amended Schedule: Schedule of this work shall be per the original contract or as agreed upon by the Town project manager

Compensation shall be amended as follows: ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITTING shall be compensated through a lump sum amount of thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$37,000). CONTINGENCY shall be compensated through a lump sum amount, as authorized, of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).
